## About the Seminar

In the twenty-first century, India is passing through the phase of transitions at unprecedented speed and scale. The transformations have reported in the political, economic and social fabric of the country. Since the independence two models of development (i.e. urbanization and modernization) have been largely influenced the social structure of Indian society. It has transformed the nature and boundaries of erstwhile social cleavages (like religion, caste, class, gender etc.) and social identities in the society. As the result of such developments, de-escalating the caste prejudice could be

observed, on the one hand, and arising the religious fundamentalism among the majoritarian sections of the society on the other hand. The steadily improvement of the status of women has been reported in recent years. From the political perspective, the role of people is evolving from being a mere voter to active participant and influencer on the majority of policy issues. Democracy has deepened further in the last seventy-five years in India. The weaker sections especially SC, ST and OBCs' participation and representation have increased manifold thereby consolidating the democratic process. Another trend which can be seen in politics is that media does not accurately represent the voice of the people. Now, the media participates in Indian politics and elections rather than only reporting on them. The nature of party politics, the way agendas are created, the priority of policies, and the people's ambitions have changed significantly. The politics of defection and unholy and unprincipled alliances has destroyed the ideologies of well-known political parties. The political choices are fundamentally shaping the future developmental trajectory. Indian economy is one of the fastest transforming economies in the world. This has become possible because of the liberalization and globalization which integrate Indian economy with the world economy. To further encourage wealth, the nation has also been opening its doors to investors and foreign businesses. Moreover, Indian economy is also facing a number of challenges including high levels of inflation, an unstable rupee, corruption, unemployment, rising inequality, population density, large current account deficit, huge dependence of population on agriculture, and low level of technology etc. These factors present both opportunities and challenges for the country's economic growth in the years ahead. The seminar will try to understand the nature of the policy choices India confronts today, the intersections between them, government's perspective on the way forward, and the broader political economy.
